Students took part in a four-day camp as part of Estrella's Kid's College, where courses are offered through July 28.

Maureen Hannon, community education coordinator, said the 6-year-old summer program is for ages 4-18.

Topics include art, language, music, science and math, as well as babysitting and childcare. Hannon said courses, tailored to each age group, start at \$49.

"We want to bring the kids onto campus and give them a little bit of the college <u>experience</u> and (get them) engaged into discussions about college while having fun," she said.

Joe Kalfus, adjunct professor at Estrella and a Tolleson Union High School culinary teacher, said the summer program is a marketing tool for the culinary school.

"We're just trying to introduce students to culinary school as a job rather than a hobby," he said while dicing potatoes for breakfast burritos.

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
