Fresh & Easy kicks off Shop for Schools program

Fresh & Easy Neighborhood Market kicked off registration for its 2011 Shop for Schools fundraising program.

For the first time, schools can register at freshandeasy.com/shopforschools by Sept. 15.

All schools with pupils in kindergarten through eighth grade within a three-mile radius of a Fresh & Easy store are eligible to participate. Those schools receive a \$1 cash donation for every \$20 receipt collected from any Fresh & Easy store from Sept. 15 through Dec. 31.

The school that raises the most money in the state through receipt collection will also win a \$5,000 bonus

In addition to collecting receipts, schools can have their own Shopping Night, a fundraising event

where 5 percent of a local Fresh & Easy store's total sales on a designated evening are donated to the school.

Last year, schools raised more than \$1.3 million through Shop for Schools and Shopping Nights, with participating schools in Phoenix raising more than \$140,000. Schools are able to use those funds for whatever they need most.
