Desert Star School pupils read millions of words through program

Two pupils at Desert Star School have read 2 million words for the school's Accelerated Reader Program. Fifth-grader Caleb DeShazer and eighth-grader Josh Heinz accomplished the feat.

Five pupils, Myles Herman, seventh grade, Derrick McBride, seventh grade, Mikayla O'Brien, fifth grade, Ethan Kuespert, seventh grade and Alvin Locke, seventh grade, each read 1 million words.

The program is for pupils in kindergarten through eighth grade, and encourages them to read a variety of books and then test their comprehension skills with a quiz. Pupils are given a test to determine where they feel comfortable reading at the beginning of the school year, and then they move up reading grade levels based on the quizzes they take. The program counts their words read per book.
