

# Three Maricopa Community Colleges Named Among Top Ten Percent in the Nation

Three Maricopa Community Colleges have been recognized by the Aspen Institute among the nation's 120 top community colleges. Estrella Mountain, Paradise Valley and Scottsdale Community Colleges are the only institutions in the State of Arizona to receive the recognition. Each college can compete for a \$1 million award through the 2013 Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence.

Each year, the Aspen Institute identifies the top 10 percent of all institutions that excel in four key areas: graduation rates, degrees awarded, student retention rates, and equity in student outcomes. The Aspen Institute narrows this list to eight-to-ten finalists in September, and will conduct site visits to each of the finalists in the fall. Prize winners will be announced in March 2013.

"At a time when a college degree is essential to entering the middle class, community colleges offer the most promising path to education and employment for literally millions of Americans."




