Goodyear police K-9 unit gets gift of protective vest

The Goodyear Police Department's K-9 unit has received a donation from the Sahuaro State Kennel Club of a ballistic vest for use by department dogs.

The protective vest, known as a "Buka," is valued at \$2,500 and is worn by police dogs during highrisk deployments, such as building searches, tracking, narcotics and explosives detection, authorities said.

IRS delays acceptance of returns using Form 8863

The Internal Revenue Service has announced that by mid-February, it will begin accepting tax returns that claim two higher-education credits.

Taxpayers using Form 8863 will have to wait until then before filing their 2012 tax returns, according to the IRS office in Phoenix.

The form is used to claim two higher educations credits - the American Opportunity Tax Credit and the Lifetime Learning Credit, officials start.

In the meantime, taxpayers claiming other education related tax benefits, such as the tuition and fees deduction and student loan interest, can begin filing their returns, officials said.
